2018–2019 Third Quarter Report





1. INTRODUCTION

This quarterly report is for the period of 1 January to 31 March 2019 and reports on the delivery of the Hobsons Bay City Council 2018–19 Capital Works Program.

The purpose of the report is to provide Council with a status report for the third quarter of the 2018–19 Capital Works Program. This report provides a capture of the total expenditure during the period January to March 2019 being the third quarter, including budget, expenditure, major achievements and project challenges. The information contained within this report is made available for the community through a range of forums including social and print media, e-newsletters and stakeholder communications.

2. 2018-19 CAPITAL WORKS

Program Overview


On 26 June 2018, Council adopted the 2018–19 Capital Works Program budget of \$44.090 million. This included \$39.630 million of current year new works and \$4.460 million associated with works carried over from the previous year as reported in March 2018.

The budget associated with works carried over from the previous year was revised from \$4.460 million to \$7.395 million as reported in July 2018 and additional income of \$1.031 million, and therefore, the total 2018–19 Capital Works Program budget is \$48.056 million as shown in the graph below.

Further income is confirmed for the Open Space Enhancement and Access Package which contributes funds towards the development of a Croft Reserve Master Plan, review of the Don McLean Reserve Master Plan and Open Space Improvements at Brooklyn Reserve and Duane Reserves.

As at the end of March 2019, \$21.222M or 44% per cent of the capital budget has been expended.

4. KEY PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS/ACHIEVEMENTS



Cherry Lake Ward

Altona Beach Precinct Seasonal Trail Closure of Esplanade

The Altona Beach Precinct Summer Trial commenced mid-December 2018 and concluded mid-March 2019 which ran for a total of 12 week period.

As part of the Summer Trial a number of streetscape interventions were undertaken including:

Footpath extension and formation of new 'parklets' along the southern end of Pier Street (opposite the shops).



Activation of Weaver Reserve through the continuation of temporary weekly market stalls and various community events.




Traffic closure of the Esplanade from Pier Street to Bent to improve pedestrian connectivity and access from the beach and adjacent open space (Weaver Reserve) with temporary 'beach boxes' pop ups with shade provision and seating.




In general, the Summer Trial was an overall success and resulted in a safer environment for pedestrians and created better connections for the community. It also allowed for improved policing operational activities and significantly reduced anti-social behaviour in particular hoon driving along the Esplanade. These trials will help inform Council on the future thinking around the beach and Pier Street precinct.

Throughout the duration of the Altona Beach Precinct Summer Trial, council received a total of 267 survey responses via Council's Participate webpage. 88% of respondents were in support of the trial and/or had further suggestions, while only 12% of respondents did not support the trial or were unsure. The following graph provides an overview of responses received.

Additionally, the Altona Beach Precinct Summer Trial received generally positive feedback on Council's social media posts and attracted a lot of attention. Upon the opening of the trial, Council's Facebook post received: 442 likes, 57 loves, 21 wows and lots of praise in the comments from the community. In total 12.8K reach and 2.7K clicks/actions.

Skeleton Creek Shared Trail Stage 3 & 4

A second community drop in session with community was held on 6 April 2019 and the revised plans were put forward and were very well received by the community.

Stage 4 – Point Cook Road to St Anthony Court Detailed design will now be finalised with a plan to commence construction works in July 2019.

Strand Ward

Bryan Martyn Oval Redevelopment project

Redevelopment works to the existing sportsfield at Bryan Martyn Oval were completed in February 2019. The works form part of Council's sports field redevelopment program and features a new central turf cricket wicket; a new underground drainage system; a new and improved irrigation system; a new boundary fence and two new coaches/players shelters. As part of the works, approximately 6,500 tonnes of quarried sand was used to construct the new oval surface, which equates to about 216 truckloads. Following delivery to the site, the sand was levelled across the oval and consolidated, providing an even base for 16,000m2 of instant turf laid across the oval surface. The oval will remain closed to the public until May 2019 to allow the new grassed surface to successfully establish. The sporting clubs who use Bryan Martyn Oval for training and matches are temporarily relocated to other Council reserves whilst the oval remains closed.





5. KEY PROJECT CHALLENGES

Armstrong Reserve

Soil testing has identified contamination across the project site. On discussing with the consultant, the best way forward was to do a second round of testing with different bore locations to see if the contaminated pockets can be further contained and a suitable management plan prepared. Second testing results have just been made available and results mean that the concept design will need to be modified. project re scoping is now required to identify the best outcome in light of the challenges.
