Second Quarter Report





1. INTRODUCTION

This quarterly report is for the period of September to 31 December 2021 and provides an update on the delivery of the Hobsons Bay City Council 2021-22 Capital Works Program.

The purpose of the report is to provide Council with a progress update for the second quarter 2021-22 Capital Works Program including expenditure, major achievements and project challenges. The information contained within this report is made available for the community on Council's website.

2. 2021-22 CAPITAL WORKS

Program Overview


On 29 June 2021 Council adopted the 2021-22 Capital Works Program budget of \$64.144 million. This included \$67.433 million of new works from 2021-22 and \$3.289 million associated with works brought forward to the 2020-21 financial year.

In September 2021, the budget associated with carryover works was revised from \$3.289 million brought forward to \$0.675 million carryover.

During the second quarter of the 2021-22 financial year, total unbudgeted income of \$1.976 million was received. Therefore, the total 2021-22 Capital Works Program budget is \$70.084 million, including \$67.433 million of new works, \$0.675 million of carryover works and \$1.976 million unbudgeted income, as pictured in the graph below.

As at the end of December 2021, \$21.080 million of the capital works budget has been expended. This represents 30 per cent expenditure against the \$70.084 million Capital Works Program budget.

The following graph shows the budget versus the amount that was spent for the five financial years from 2016-17 to 2021-22


Capital Works Program Budget vs Actuals FY2016–17 to FY2021–22 as at end of Q2



4. KEY PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS/ACHIEVEMENTS

Cherry Lake Ward

Altona Foreshore Pedestrian Access Ramp (opposite Mount Street)

To ensure the ongoing protection of community and residential infrastructure along the Altona foreshore from the impacts of sea level rise and the increasing intensity and frequency of storm events the seawall is being raised. As part of these works pedestrian access to the beach is also being formalised by way of ramps, steps and viewing platforms.

The installation of the Mount St access ramp is progressing well with the two tiers of concrete foundations completed and the upper platform being formed ready for reinforcement and concrete. The access ramp is due for completion in February 2022.

Cherry Lake Ward

Bayfit Swim Centre - Investigation and Maintenance Planning

During the lockdown period the existing pool plant, building structure, changerooms and gym were inspected to determine the existing building condition and to schedule maintenance work over the coming years.

Also, Council took the opportunity to re-caulk around the edges of the two main pools, spa and remedial pool. The concrete on the north and west sides of the childrens 'Learn to Swim' pool was also re-surfaced.

Rymill Court, Altona North, from Blackshaws Road to end

Rymill Court, Altona North rehabilitation works is completed. Works included the installation of new drainage, kerb and channel, minor footpath replacement and asphalt rehabilitation works.

Wetlands Ward

Russell Court Kindergarten

Works to Russell Court include new flooring, ceiling and painting to the kindergarten rooms as well as an upgrade to the Maternal and Child Health offices.

Works have commenced and kindergarten to be completed end of Jan 2022 and remaining works to be completed end of Feb 2022.

A More Connected Community - Maher Road - Better Places Laverton - Traffic Calming Work & Streetscapes

As part of the Better Places Laverton project a new shared path which will provide safe links for pedestrians and cyclists will be constructed in Maher Road. The upgrade will provide crossings that will enhance pedestrian crossing safety, enhance wayfinding and lower car speeds. This project is currently in detailed design stage and is programmed for construction in April – June 2022.

Seabrook East Local Area Traffic Management

As part of safe travel to schools program traffic calming works along Canonbury Circle have been completed. These works involved installation of raised platforms at the intersections of Canonbury Circle and Finnbarr Way, Tintern Court, Cintra Court and Glenelg Way.

Strand Ward

Williamstown Cricket Ground - Practice facility upgrade

The upgrade to the cricket practice facility has been completed bringing the nets up to current compliance standards resulting in increased safety and greater usability of the nets.

The upgrade of the cricket practice nets included the levelling of the sub-base to ensure a consistent and safe playing surface, inclusion of hard netting for the frame and soft netting between practice lanes to prevent stray balls from escaping the facility, inclusion of roof netting compliant with Cricket Australia guidelines. The practice nets include six synthetic turf and seven natural turf practice lanes.







Paine Street Laneway - Fence

The works comprise new fences to the East and West boundaries of the Newport Bowls Club and an interactive fence to the north boundary. The north boundary separates the bowls club from Paine Reserve and follows the pedestrian path linking Market Street to the Newport Library. The east and west fences have already been installed and the puzzle elements for the north boundary are currently being manufactured for installation in January 2022.



The John Street Laneway rehabilitation works has been completed. Works included installation of new asphalt laneway, bluestone channel and new underground drainage works.

5. KEY PROJECT CHALLENGES

Projects delayed due to COVID

A number of capital works and Civil projects are being delayed due to significant numbers of consultants and contractors testing positive with COVID. Although we continue to work closely with the consultants and contractors on the design documentation and construction programs to mitigate these delays some of the projects will not be completed by the due date. This may have an impact on clubs and residents having access to new facilities.

Council is also experiencing price increases due to material shortages and general supply chain issues. This is evident in the cost plans for future projects, tender prices and variation requests from contractors.

Queen Street, Altona Footpath works

Council recently completed minor footpath repair works at Queen Street (opposite Coles supermarket) to improve the health of a significant tree (Ficus macrophylla/ Moreton Bay Fig).

The tree roots had lifted the existing footpath making access difficult for pedestrians. In consultation with Council's arborist process was put in place to protect the tree and its existing root system whilst we replace the footpath with new kerb and channel. The existing 400mm thick concrete/ asphalt layer is now replaced with 40mm sustainable permeable paving (waste tyre based permeable pavement which is made of up to 50 per cent recycled material). This will allow water to penetrate directly into the tree root system prolonging the life of this significant tree. The tree roots are continuously inspected by Council's arborist to ensure no roots are damaged during these works.

6. MAJOR PROJECTS UPDATE

Altona Sports Centre Extension

Altona Sports Centre has been transformed into an indoor and outdoor multi-sport environmentally friendly and accessible facility. The \$17M project in partnership with the state government and Altona Sports Centre Limited was five years in the making and includes an additional four indoor multi-sport courts, seating for 1,000 people, a multi-purpose room, café, administration areas, four additional change rooms, umpire change rooms, storage, first aid room and two new outdoor courts with lighting.

The construction of the external forecourt which will comprise basketball half courts, seating and landscaping has kicked off and is expected to be completed in April 2022.

The redevelopment will provide more opportunities for people of all ages to participate in netball and basketball as well as opening programming options that can be utilised by the broader community.

J T Gray Pavilion

JT Gray Reserve is one of Council's regional sport and recreation reserves and caters for cricket and soccer throughout the year as well as providing public open space for local residents.

The design of the pavilion has now been completed following an extensive period of investigation and modelling to ensure that the structural design is able mitigate the risk to occupants from a low frequency, high consequence event within the South Crude Tank Farm associated with the Altona Refinery Complex.

Preliminary earthworks have started on site with the main construction activities commencing in January 2022 and completion targeted for December 2022.

HD Graham Reserve, Altona Meadows Sports Facility Development

HD Graham Reserve Sports Facility project scope include the construction of new sportsground, irrigation, floodlight and pavilion.

Sportsground, irrigation and floodlights are nearing completion. Pavilion works has begun and will be completed in Sep 2022.

Donald McLean Reserve

The construction of the pavilion is progressing well and the new pavilion is scheduled to be completed by mid 2022.

The new cricket practice nets have been completed.

Construction of the open space will commence in mid 2022.








Dennis Reserve, Williamstown - Multipurpose Pavilion
