1. INTRODUCTION

This quarterly report is for the period of 1 April to 30 June 2022 and provides an update on the delivery of the Hobsons Bay City Council 2021-22 Capital Works Program.

The purpose of the report is to provide Council with a progress update for the fourth quarter 2021-22 Capital Works Program including expenditure, major achievements and project challenges. The information contained within this report is made available for the community on Council's website.

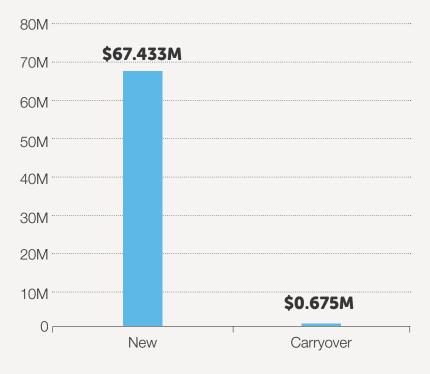
2. **2021–22 CAPITAL WORKS**

Program Overview

On 29 June 2021 Council adopted the 2021-22 Capital Works Program budget of \$64.144 million. In September 2021, the budget associated with carryover works was \$0.675 million. Therefore, the total 2021-22 Capital Works Program budget is \$68.108 million, including \$67.433 million of new works and \$0.675 million of carryover works.

As at the end of June 2022, \$58,346 million of the capital works budget has been expended. This represents 86 per cent expenditure against the \$68.108 million Capital Works Program budget.

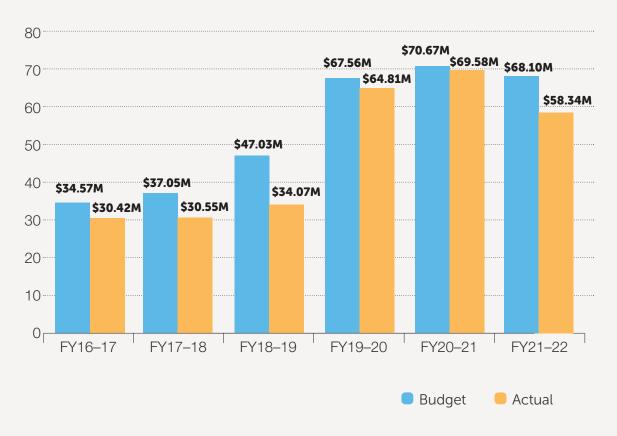
FY2021-22 Capital Works Program budget \$68.108 million = New + Carryover





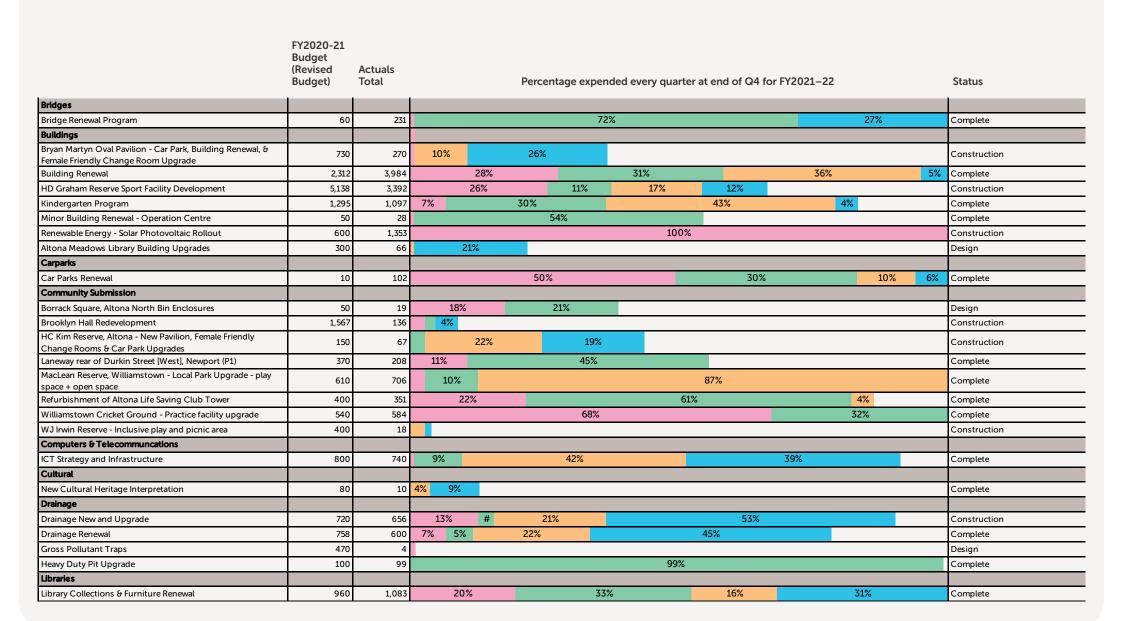
The following graph shows the budget versus the amount that was spent for the six financial years from 2016-17 to 2021-22

4. KEY PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS/ACHIEVEMENTS

Cherry Lake Ward

Pier St and Weaver Reserve

Weaver Reserve landscape works are completed. Temporary fencing will stay till the end of August to allow the grass to establish.

The Weaver Reserve Carpark works have commenced and scheduled for completion at the end of August 2022.

Pier Street streetscape improvement works commenced in May 2022 and are due for completion at the end of September 2022.

Altona Activity Centre Road Safety Projects

The construction of new roundabouts at the intersections of Blyth Street/Seves Street, Blyth Street/Mount Street and Blyth Street/Bent Street are now completed. These works include the installation of a new roundabout, minor footpath, and kerb and channel works.

The second part of these works have also been completed. This includes the construction of new roundabouts at the intersections of Queen Street/Sargood Street and Queen Street/McBain Street and an upgraded pedestrian crossing on Queen Street at Altona Library.

Cherry Lake Ward

Altona Seawall and Shared Trail

Approximately 670m of the shared trail is currently being widened to 6m to deliver safe and sustainable passage for all ages and abilities. The old shared trail was unable to accommodate the volume and mix of users who frequently stroll, cycle, walk their dogs or roller blade along the sea front.

The Altona seawall is also being realigned and raised to protect council's assets from local coastal processes and hazards, sea level rise and wave and tide events.

The project has also received grants administered by Department of Jobs, Precincts and Regions and by Department Environment, Land, Water and Planning.

Wetlands Ward

Bladin Street Reserve, Laverton

Bladin Street Reserve is a small house block-sized reserve containing a playground and mature trees. The scope for this reserve is to include new soft landscaping including tree planting, new seating and upgrades to the existing playground. The works are completed.

Wetlands Ward

Ascot Street, Balmoral Street & Grace Street Rehabilitation Works, Laverton

Works at Ascot Street and Balmoral Street have been completed. The works include the renewal of kerb and channel, minor footpath works and asphalt resurfacing.

Works at Grace Street has commenced and at the completion of the civil works, tree planting as part of the "Cool Streets Program" will be carried out.

Wetlands Ward

Henderson Street Reserve, Laverton

The full upgrade of this park includes a playground upgrade a new play space and open lawn within the reserve; new pedestrian paths and provision of recreational activities for younger children to teenagers; and installation of new street furniture, bbq area with a drinking fountain and soft landscaping including tree planting. Works are due to be completed by the end of September 2022.

Strand Ward

Blenheim Road, Newport Community Park & Public Toilet

This new public park is taking shape with the installation of the large shade shelters and the setting out of the landscape areas and pathways. The construction of the new toilet is due for completion at the end of September 2022.



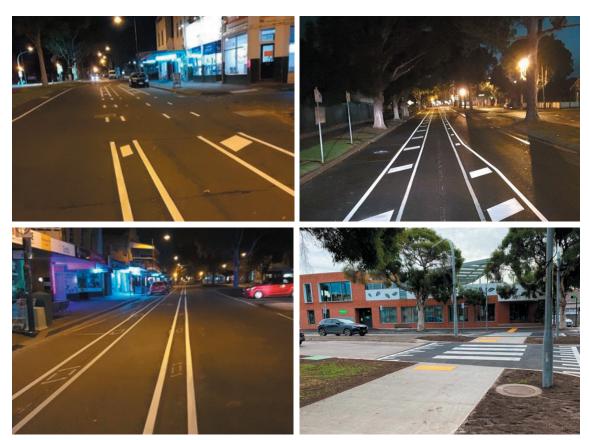

Strand Ward

Ferguson Street (Blackspot) Bicycle Connectivity Between Melbourne Road & The Strand, Williamstown

New raised crossings in Ferguson Street have been installed near the intersections of Melbourne Road and Bath Place with line marking along remainder of Ferguson Street.

These works are part of Councils Blackspot program and were completed by end of June 2022.

MacLean Reserve, Williamstown - Local Park Upgrade

Works in Maclean Reserve were completed in May 2022. There is now a new play space, picnic shelter, footpaths, seating, tables, irrigated soft landscaping including garden beds, and new mature tree plantings.

5. KEY PROJECT CHALLENGES

Ongoing COVID impacts

A number of capital works projects are being delayed due to the ongoing impact of COVID.

There are a number of challenges that are facing the construction industry including the lack of materials due to the ongoing impact of COVID. This short supply is also driving up the cost of materials in particular steel and timber in the last 6 months.

There are also still project delays as a result of consultants, contractors and staff contracting COVID and having to remain in isolation or take leave to care for relatives with COVID.

Fluid job market with a lot of people leaving and moving between organisations creating start stop scenarios on projects and subsequent delays.

Council continues to work closely with the consultants and contractors on the design documentation and construction programs to mitigate these delays, and in the process of reviewing the program to mitigate these impacts and facilitate the delivery of the delayed projects.

6. MAJOR PROJECTS UPDATE

HD Graham Pavilion, Altona Meadows

The pavilion has reached lock-up stage with the completion of the brick and cement sheet cladding and the installation of the windows. The internal services, wall, ceiling and floor finishes will take place over the next two months. The final activity will be the external hard and soft landscaping which will bring the pavilion to completion in September 2022.

Donald McLean Reserve

The Donald McLean Reserve pavilion upgrade is complete. The external carparking is due to be completed in October 2022.

The open space project continues to progress with the installation of a half basketball court, new BBQ shelter, and progression of groundworks for new pump track. The installation of the new playground equipment will follow shortly.

JT Gray Reserve

Works are continuing to progress JT Gray Reserve despite delays with obtaining construction materials. The southern section of the slab of the pavilion has been poured and the northern area is being prepared ready for concrete. The building itself will soon start to take shape with the installation of the structural steel frame and the wall panel delivery.

The new cricket net area, comprising four synthetic lanes, has been cleared and is also being prepared for the base to be installed.

The behind goal netting, which is 40 meters wide and eight meters high is being installed on the eastern and western side of the pavilion to protect the building from stray balls.

Design work is continuing for the floodlights onsite with construction due to commence over the summer season.

Dennis Reserve Pavilion

Dennis Reserve Pavilion will provide for multi-use spaces that can support a variety of activities. The final set of plans have been developed and a town planning application has been submitted.

Construction tender documentation is being prepared and a competitive tender will be sought from the market in Q1 22/23.

Brooklyn Hall Redevelopment

The redeveloped facility will provide a community kitchen, meeting rooms and flexible spaces for community groups. The works are due for completion in early 2023.

Temporary construction fencing has been erected around the site and the old hall has been emptied. Surplus items of furniture and household items from the hall were donated to the West Welcome Wagon in support of asylum seekers.

The onsite works have been delayed due to supply issues with structural steel and the contractor is currently looking at ways to reprogram their works to mitigate the delays.

The landscaping design is continuing and will include a community garden component.
