INTERIOR:

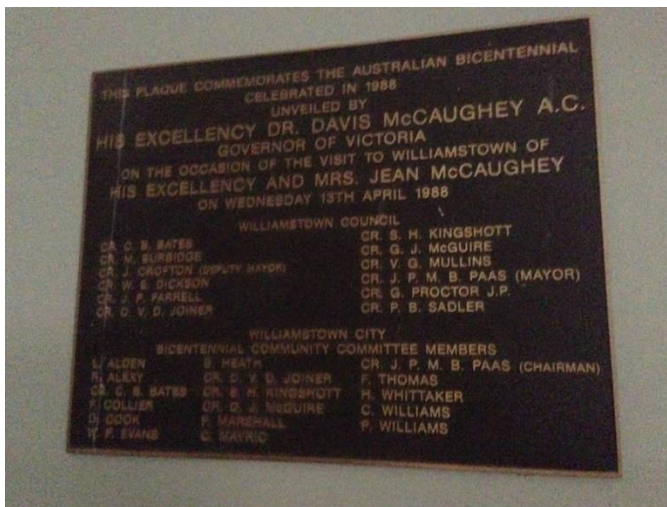
Williamstown Town Hall Foyer plaque, 1927

The opening of the Williamstown Town Hall (ballroom) 18 May 1927



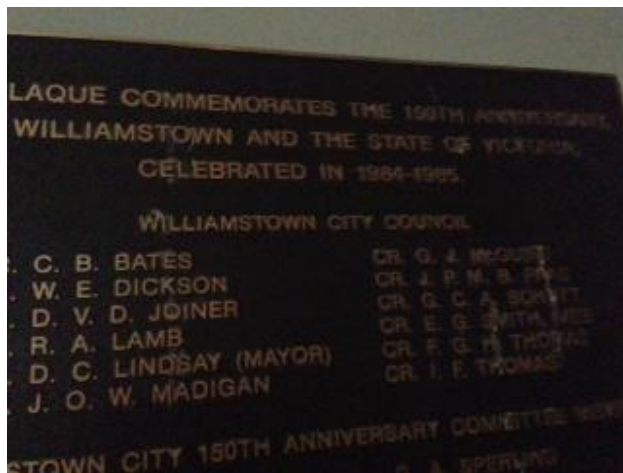
Williamstown Town Hall Foyer plaque, 1988

Note: several other plaques are in the Williamstown Town Hall foyer, but the above are the primary civic ones and the largest. The Sons of Williamstown memorial board is also in the foyer, as is a plaque noting Ada Cambridge installed in 1946 by the *Lindsay Gordon Lovers' Society*.



EXTERIOR:

Williamstown Town Hall Foundation stone, dated 5th June 1918.

Notes Mayor and Councillors + builder, architect,

This is located external at the front of the main entrance, to the east of the front door.



Williamstown Town Hall commemorative plaque 11 April 1856 – 11 April 1956.
Marking the Centenary of the first meeting of Williamstown Council
This is located to the west of the front door, toward the carpark.



Proposed location for a new commemorative tablet June 2018

With heritage support, to be sited on the exterior of front building of the Williamstown Town Hall,
On the eastern side of front door toward the Library (proximity to the 1918 foundation stone).
