Bryan Martyn Oval redevelopment

Works to the existing sportsfield at Bryan Martyn Oval in Newport are progressing well. The new surface has been shaped, a new cricket wicket bench has been constructed, and new drainage and irrigation installed. About 6,500 tonnes of quarried sand, which equates to about 216 truckloads, has been spread across the oval surface. The sand is being levelled across the oval ready for 16,000 square metres of instant turf to be installed. Following grassing, a new boundary fence and players shelters will be installed. Works are expected to be complete early February. The oval will remain closed until April to allow the new grass to successfully establish.

Skeleton Creek Trail upgrade

The remaining upgrades of the Skeleton Creek Trail are coming soon, with the final sections complete by August 2019. These works will improve accessibility by upgrading the three metre wide concrete path between Ravenswood Court through to St Anthony Court. Bike maintenance stations, additional tree planting, bench seats and dog waste dispensers will be included in the works over the coming months. Homestead Run
