Kerbside waste and recycling review

Council's new waste and recycling service has been in operation since February 2020. Following a review of the service's first 12 months, Council will implement a range of changes to further improve our waste management system, including

- introducing weekly collections for general waste
- transitioning food organics and garden organics (FOGO) collections to forthightly
- trialling the use of compostable paper bags for FOGO

Council is currently developing an implementation plan for the changes and will keep the community updated on timeframes. Until then, it is business as usual with the current scheduled collections and calendars.

For residents who have already participated in the free COVID-19 interim upsize for garbage bins, you can continue to use the 240L bin at no charge for the time being. Council



Spotswood and South Kingsville reimagined

A 'GreenLine' enabling residents to cycle to the city in 20 minutes, a major revamp of the Spotswood industrial area and extended 40 km/h zones in activity centre streets are just some of the ideas being considered in the next phase of the Better Places Spotswood and South Kingsville program. After several months of community consultation, the Better Places initiative has developed 16 place-based projects to make Spotswood and South Kingsville even better places to live, work and visit. Womindjeka – gateway flags

During July, flags printed with Womindjeka are flying at the gateway flagpole sites in Melbourne Road (Spotswood), Millers Road (Brooklyn), Kororoit Creek Road (Altona) and Queen Street (Altona Meadows), helping us all promote First Australians' culture. Womindjeka is a Kulin Nation word used as a welcome, translating as 'Come, with purpose'. The flags have been designed by Aretha Brown, a proud Gumbaynggirr woman, artist (her work includes the street art 'We Are Here' at Challis Street, Newport) and former Prime Minister of the National Indigenous Youth Parliament.
