Tree planting in Altona

The 2018 tree planting season has kicked off with over 300 trees having been planted in Altona and Seaholme.

Lophostemon confertus trees have been planted along Grieve Parade to provide summer shade while Australian natives, *Banksia integrafolia* trees have been planted along Queen Street to provide colour, shade and a food source for birds.

Native tree species *Tristaniopsis laurina* has also been planted along Ransom Avenue, which will significantly improve the streetscape.

New solar lighting for Pipeline Reserve, Seabrook

Council is preparing to install new solar lighting at Pipeline Reserve, Seabrook between Point Cook Road and Shane Avenue over the coming weeks. The Reserve is home to a children's play area and a new footpath connecting Shane Avenue and Point Cook Road, both of which are currently unlit.

Planting at the GROW site and Laverton Creek

Council is proposing to reinvigorate the landscaping at the 'GROW' site, corner of Merton and Queen Sts, Altona Meadows during winter following ongoing vandalism.
