Like other metropolitan areas in Melbourne, Hobsons Bay is under pressure to accommodate new medium and higher density development. Currently, Hobsons Bay is home to 95,395 residents and this number is expected to increase to around 112,462 by 2036.

While Council cannot prevent growth from occurring, it is how we respond to managing change that is important.

Council is required to implement the New Residential Zones introduced by the Victorian Government as a tool to manage residential growth and change. We've been busy preparing a suite of important strategies to help guide and determine how we can plan for the changing needs of our community now and in the future over the next 20 years.

WHY HAVE NEW RESIDENTIAL ZONES BEEN INTRODUCED?

The Victorian Government has introduced the New Residential Zones in order to manage growth and change in our neighbourhoods.

Measured growth is a positive because it supports increased services, public transport, our businesses, shops, health facilities and open space.

Hobsons Bay is experiencing a growing and changing population with increasing pressure to accommodate new medium and higher density development, while preserving neighbourhood character.

The New Residential Zones provides more certainty to the community and developers by putting the right zone in the right places.

#OW HAVE THE NEW ZONES **BEEN APPLIED**

We have drafted three important strategies to inform our decisions on where the New Residential Zones should go.



HOUSING **STRATEGY**

Our draft Housing Strategy provides a framework for how we can manage housing growth and change.

WHAT ARE THE NEW **RESIDENTIAL ZONES**

There are three New Residential Zones - each have different rules and requirements regarding maximum height limits, minimum garden requirements and neighbourhood character objectives. This means that the amount and type of housing that is allowed will vary across the suburbs.

Hobsons Bay is rich in historical artefacts. On public display are cannons, anchors, heritage fountains, unique sculptures, artworks and honour boards commemorating those enlisted in service. Council undertakes extensive research and works with specialist conservators who use science-based techniques to conserve, restore and preserve buildings and objects to ensure architecturally and historically significant objects and buildings have an expanded life span and don't disappear from our streets.

Many residents may remember having wedding photos taken in front of the Williamstown Botanic Garden gates when they were painted white. After a comprehensive investigation including

microscopic analysis of paint scaping, the gates were restored to their original black with gold trimmings. Similarly, the cast-iron Wilkinson Fountain that is located next to the Williamstown Visitor Information Centre was also white at one point in its history and has been repainted to its original maroon colour following paint scraping analysis. The drinking fountain, which includes a sculpted heron, was originally made in Glasgow, Scotland. When it was first installed in the 1880s, cups hung off the heron that were used to drink from.

Council works closely with Altona, Laverton and Williamstown Historical Societies. The societies are often a first point of call for information on the historical context. A fundamental principle of heritage conservation is maintaining the integrity and authenticity of an item, and preserving as much original fabric as possible.

Future projects involve cleaning of the War Memorial in Newport, conserving the Ian Bow Fountain in Altona and preserving the Capstan and Cannons in Williamstown.



During 2017-18, Hobsons Bay recorded its biggest increase in pokies losses in five years, jumping more than half a million dollars to \$47.4 million. That's \$130,000 lost every day.

Research tells us that approximately twothirds of these losses are from people experiencing harm from gambling. Gambling harm isn't just about losing money. It also affects self-esteem, relationships, physical and mental health, work performance and social life.

Council is committed to reducing gambling harm in Hobsons Bay. Our Problem Gambling (Electronic Gaming Machines) Policy Statement 2015 articulates Council's commitment to

managing and minimising the negative impacts of pokies in Hobsons Bay. Council is also part of the Alliance for Gambling Reform who are actively campaigning for reforms to reduce harm from pokies in the lead up to the Victorian election.

With Gambling Harm Awareness Week on 8 to 14 October, Council urges community members to have an open discussion about the impact gambling may be having on their lives with friends and family. Spring is also the perfect time to get out the mower and clean up your yard, including vacant blocks. Mowing and clearing debris from vacant blocks reduces fire risk and is required throughout the year. Council's next vacant block inspections will be undertaken in October and November.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR WARD?



STRAND WARD

Work on upgrading the **Bryan Martyn** Oval in Newport has commenced and the oval will remain closed during the construction. The upgrade involves reconstructing the central turf cricket wicket, a new irrigation system, underground drainage, laying a new grassed surface and installing a new boundary fence.

Following the completion of the oval upgrade, works will commence redeveloping the southern netball court including: constructing a spectator viewing shelter, installing new floodlight towers and repositioning the existing netball court to allow for a second netball court in the future. Work on the **Spotswood Structure** Plan is progressing and a background paper identifying issues and opportunities for the future of land use and development in the area will be available soon. Thank you to Newport residents who provided feedback on the **Newport** Structure Plan. The draft Newport Structure Plan provides a long term vision for Newport and identifies potential opportunities for improvements within the area and directs future commercial and residential growth. All feedback received will be considered by Council and used in the preparation of the final Newport Structure Plan.

Keep an eye out on Participate Hobsons Bay for the consultation on the proposed traffic calming improvements along the Esplanade at Williamstown Beach. Consultation will look at replacing the bollards that are installed every summer.





CHERRY LAKE WARD

The beachside G.H. Ransom Reserve in Altona has been upgraded! The popular local reserve has a new public toilet, picnic and BBQ facilities, and a new play space, landscaped garden beds and new trees.

The detailed concept plan for Altona's A.H. Ford Reserve is currently being developed following widespread community input. The plan addresses playground location, the cricket oval and goal posts, an open picnic shelter seating area, inclusion of a circuit path and access through to Belmar Avenue. WETLANDS WARD

An 80 metre section of the upgraded Skeleton Creek Trail has been installed with concrete that is reinforced with 100 per cent recycled plastic fibres. The fibres, made from waste that would likely otherwise end up in landfill, replaces the steel reinforcement mesh that is traditionally used. This is ideal for salty and coastal environments, as the product will never corrode.

The concept plan for the new community park at **Epsom Street** has been finalised. Construction is expected to commence in early 2019 and will take approximately 12 months to build. The community will be invited to name the park. Keep an eye on participate.hobsonsbay.vic.gov.au to have your say.

A staged park improvement program for the Homestead Run and Barry Jones Reserves in Seabrook has been developed following community input. Suggestions included a new BBQ facility, a half court for netball and basketball, goal posts for informal play (AFL/soccer) and fencing at Homestead Reserve. Altona Meadows Community Park will receive a new toilet and dog off-
