


BIN IT THE RIGHT WAY

FINE FREE LIBRARIES!

Hobsons Bay Libraries will no longer fine members for overdue library items.

Any previously outstanding overdue fines have now been waived and no further fines will be accrued. Standard loan periods and due dates will still apply and customers with two or more overdue items will be restricted from further borrowing and accessing public PCs until the items are returned. Charges for lost or damaged library items will remain in place.

As restrictions ease, Council has reopened several venues and resumed many face-to-face services. While we look forward to welcoming everyone back, it's critical that we remain vigilant as we settle into a 'COVIDSafe' lifestyle. Please maintain a 1.5m distance from others, wear a mask when required, practice sanitisation and stay home if you are experiencing any symptoms. While many venues and services have reopened, Council's services can still be accessed from home.

- Libraries have reopened with amended hours from 1pm to 6pm Monday to Friday and 10am to 1pm on Saturday. A check-in process for contact tracing will also be required.
- Our face-to-face customer

MANY FACE-TO-FACE SERVICES ARE BACK

service at the Hobsons Bav Civic Centre has reopened. Staff will be available during business hours Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 5pm at the Civic Centre, however, the community can continue to contact Customer Service on **1300 179 944** or at customerservice@hobsonsbay. vic.gov.au.

- Our face-to-face community consultations sessions have resumed for a range of projects and issues our community can provide feedback on. The in-person sessions are in addition to the Participate Hobsons Bay website and mail outs.
- Council-managed community centres at Newport, Laverton and Seabrook will remain closed to the public, except for essential public support services.
- Immunisations will continue to be provided through two sessions per week at Williamstown Town Hall and the Laverton Community Hub until March 2021. Bookings must be made online at hobsonsbay.vic. gov.au/Immunisation.
- **Maternal and Child Health** Services (MCH) will return to full length centre consultations, with minimal home visits to be conducted (excluding vulnerable

families). Enhanced MCH and 3.5-year-old visits will be conducted via telehealth with additional centre appointments offered as required. Parent groups will remain online until 2021.

- Meals on Wheels Food Services will continue to be delivered via a contactless method. Home maintenance services for urgent jobs will gradually increase.
- The Altona Sports Centre, Bayfit Leisure Centre and Laverton Swim and Fitness Centre have reopened with COVIDSafe plans and will be subject to attendance restrictions. Please contact the centres for more information.
- . Hobsons Bay UP (Youth Services) will continue to offer youth services online, including youth engagement and leadership programs, as well as the counselling service.
- In addition to the reopening of playgrounds, outdoor gym equipment and skate parks, public barbecues have now been switched back on and will be cleaned regularly. Drinking fountains have also been reactivated.

RECYCLING 2.0 **LET'S SORT IT OUT**

To help inform residents about what can and can't be recycled, Council will be conducting bin checks across Hobsons Bay.

Bin checks will be done across all suburbs over the next few months. Residents will receive a letter when their bin is checked.

Bins with materials that can't be recycled will receive a sticker and a letter explaining what to do next.



For help with recycling, check out the Recycling 2.0 app (free in the App Store and Google Play).

There is also information on Council's website, or you can contact customer service.

Continuous improvement is at the

heart of our waste and recycling system. Following the completion of the first year of Recycling 2.0, Council will be reviewing the service in the first half of 2021.

'MAKE IT HAPPEN' GRANT PROGRAM OPENS



Grants of up to \$25,000 are available to support our community to 'Make It Happen' while we recover and reconnect as COVID-19 restrictions ease. In total, \$500,000 will be distributed to the community.

Announced in August as part of Council's Community Support Package 3, \$500,000 is allocated to this new program. Funding will support community-led recovery and reconnection as we all learn about, work through and adapt to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. With monthly assessments, the program is designed to put funds into the community quickly and with as much flexibility as possible. The program will provide support to enable activities, projects, programs, events and festivals and resources across

all sectors, including environment, sustainability, sports and recreation, ageing well, culture, projects by and for young people, multicultural, community and neighbourhood development.

The newly-designed Hobsons Bay 'Make It Happen' Recovery and Reconnection Grants Program combines and incorporates the Hobsons Bay Environmental, Events and Festival Funding, Quick Response and Community Grants into one round.

Applications can be made for funding between \$500 and \$25,000.

Grants will be assessed and awarded monthly between now and May 2021, with projects to be completed by June 2022. For more details, or to apply, visit hobsonsbay.vic.gov.au/grants or call 1300 179 944.

ESIDENTIAL ONES

The Hobsons Bay Planning Scheme is being updated.

The changes, known as Amendment C131, update the planning scheme to meet changed state government requirements in residential areas.

The amendment will ensure the estimated 443 new homes built in Hobsons Bay each year continue to meet the expectations of the community and Council.

2020 has been a tough year. There's been ups and downs and backward flips. In Hobsons Bay, there are many organisations to support you during challenging situations including financial counselling, emergency relief, utility relief and support, mental health, older people support services, LGBTIQA+ services, alcohol and other drug support, and legal help.

These services have been collated in a Hardship Support and Referrals brochure which has been translated into 15 languages and is available at hobsonsbay.vic.gov.au/ ReferralandSupportServices

If you would like to speak with someone at Council, the Hobsons Bay Community Has Heart's Community Connector program is here to help. The program links people in need due to the impacts of COVID-19 with local service providers and networks. Trained Council staff help connect community members with agencies that supply a wide range of services - for example, food hampers and pet food, medications and nappies, access to cleaning supplies and masks, social activities, employment and training information and library services.

OUTDOOR TRADING BOOSTS ENERGY AND VITALITY

A Hobsons Bay local, Pallets with Purpose founder Paul Finley Beames, ran Get Lost Travel Group (GLT) prior to COVID-19's impact on the travel industry. Faced with closing his doors for an unknown period of time, Paul pivoted into upcycled timber manufacturing.

The team at GLT traded buses for pallets and power tools after Paul tripped over a pallet on the nature strip outside a neighbouring factory. After a conversation with his neighbour, he found out the pallets were destined for landfill and the owner had a steady supply arriving regularly to the factory. Paul thought it was a waste because they were in perfect condition and the owner happily offered them to him.

"With plenty of space in the depot and a shed full of tools, I started knocking together some prototypes. It blew me away how some of the wood grain polished up. I looked around and thought, we have all this vacant space, massive workbenches, lots of tools and a lot of talented people. I knew if I could convert the space into a furniture factory, I could re-employ some of the guides who had been stood down. And Pallets with Purpose was born.

"Over the course of the last few weeks, a small but staunch group of superheroes have worked around the clock to transform the streets of Hobsons Bay for outdoor (socially distanced) dining.

"They've brought hope and happiness to businesses and communities in much need. It's incredibly heartwarming to see the joy and smiles on people's faces."

One of the biggest joys of Council's Hobsons Bay Business has Heart Outdoors project has been the rewarding experience of partnering with Paul and the team at Pallets with Purpose to bring our activation spaces to life. You can check out their recycled timber planter boxes popping up at participating businesses across Hobsons Bay this summer.

SUPPORTING **COMMUNITY SPORT**

COVID-19 has had a major impact on community sport with all club activity being suspended for extended periods. With restrictions easing, clubs are welcoming back players for the summer competition and training.

A DAY ON THE BEACH **FOR ALL**

With beach matting, free hire of beach wheelchairs, walking frames and accessible change facilities, Hobsons Bay boasts two of the most accessible beaches in Australia.

Over the past five years, Hobsons Bay has provided continued beach access and beach wheelchairs to more than 150 community members and is committed to continuing this service with COVIDSafe measures in place.

To assist in helping people of all ages and mobilities enjoy a day on the beach, wheelchairs and walking frames are available at Williamstown and Altona beaches. Free for hire, the chairs and frames can be accessed on Saturdays and Sundays between 12pm and 5pm. For information and booking details, visit hobsonsbay.vic. gov.au/AccessibleBeaches.

Beach matting is installed at both Williamstown and Altona beaches and is available seven days a week, a first in Victoria. Any visitors to the beach are invited to use the matting, but it is of particular benefit to people with prams, wheelchairs, walking and mobility aids to pass over the soft sand onto the firmer sand on the shoreline.

Across the road from Altona Beach at Weaver Reserve guests will find an accessible change facility with a change table and hoist. This facility is available for use 24/7 with a universal MLAK key. Speak to Council on **1300 179 944** for more information. BYO sling.





BE SAFE IN THE WATER

With restrictions easing and summer coming into full swing, we're all itching to get into the water. The large amount of people on the beach, a lack of preparedness due to COVID-19 and the inability of learn to swim programs to operate this year, present a series of unique challenges to Surf Lifesaving Victoria. While at the beach in Hobsons Bay or on holidays, it's more important than ever to remember to swim safely and responsibly - swim between the flags, never swim alone and understand your own ability and limitations.



THIS GIRL CAN

Want to get active? Not sure where to start? In partnership with VIC Health and This Girl Can. Council has developed physical exercise cards with an accredited physiologist. They come in four packs:

- 18-60 year old workouts
- over 60s workouts
- postnatal workouts
- wheelchair workouts

Green initiatives in Hobsons Bay

DID YOU KNOW, IN HOBSONS BAY ...?



- 1 More light-coloured roofs, paved areas and driveways are part of new developments to reduce the urban heat island effect (urban areas that are hotter than rural areas due to human activity).
- There is an increase of canopy tree plantings around properties to reduce the urban heat island effect and save on energy bills.
- More concrete made with recycled materials is being used in construction to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- 4 More roads are being paved with recycled asphalt to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
- 5 There is an increasing uptake of permeable driveway installations around homes to reduce flooding in neighbourhoods.

BAG HABITS

In Hobsons Bay, we could recycle about 78 truckloads more each year if we all did one easy thing – that is to put recyclables in the bin loose, not in bags. Break open the plastic bag and release recyclables before binning them.

To recycle plastic bags, take them to your nearest REDcycle collection point.

Let's not waste a recycling opportunity. Break the bag habit, empty recyclables loose into the bin, so we can recycle more, waste less and look after our home.

LOCAL TREASURE MAP

Council's conservation map plots important features of our area's unique plants and animals. Originally created for World Environment Day, anyone can use the map as a guide to find the elusive Altona Skipper Butterfly, the critically endangered Swift Parrot, bird hides that enhance bird-watching, significant trees such as the Moreton Bay Fig, Sheoaks and much more. The conservation map uses the Google Maps platform and can be viewed on mobile phones.

Council is taking the lead in generating renewable energy and stimulating the local economy through the roll out of a Virtual Energy Network (VEN) and the installation of new solar panels on more than 40 Council buildings.

Within two years, Hobsons Bay will be powering itself with clean, green, renewable energy and will have expanded the network to enable community access. Council will provide residents and businesses with access to affordable green electricity, while simultaneously contributing to the Community Vision of zero net emissions by 2030.

The Virtual Power initiative is an industry leading, large scale solar energy project that will see Hobsons Bay accelerate the uptake of renewable energy, create local jobs and reduce the impacts of climate change.






The first solar infrastructure is already being installed with more sites to come online in early 2021. The community access model will offer opportunities for residents or businesses to participate as a producer of energy, a user of low-cost green energy, or both.

ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS

- generation of almost four megawatts of solar power in the first stage
- reduction of greenhouse gas emissions by almost 4,000 tonnes per annum, or up to 55 per cent of Council's total carbon emissions, within two years.
- built-in flexibility to expand and adapt to new technology
- substantial acceleration of zero net emissions targets for Council and for Hobsons Bay

The Virtual Power project has the capacity to expand through further phases, including energy storage capacity.

- reduced barriers for the community to access low cost, renewable energy
- opportunity for the community to participate in a Hobsons Bay Community Solar Network within the first two years

ECONOMIC BENEFITS

- stimulus of our local economy through the creation of local jobs
- year on year savings in energy costs, redirecting Council's funds back into community programs



The Virtual Power project will set the standard for implementing energy systems within local government. It has the capacity to be replicated across the country, while stimulating the same surge of benefits, including job creation, in local communities.

PARENTS CONNECT DURING PANDEMIC

The COVID-19 lockdowns have shown us that finding new ways to connect with each other is incredibly important, especially in times of change. If the phase 'it takes a village to raise a child' rings true, then this year has been particularly challenging for new parents.

For Melanie Hale and her 12-weekold baby girl, Eleanor, it has been just that. Without any family within their 5km and 25km radius during lockdown, a Virtual Parents Group has been an important source of connection and support.

Through regular online meetings, the group discusses their babies' development, shares stories and asks

While Melanie was pregnant with Eleanor, she was worried that the parents group wouldn't be able to run at all. Having only lived in the area for a few years, she's enjoyed meeting other local parents and sharing the experience of new parenthood with other parents.

New parents will be contacted by a Maternal and Child Health Nurse when their baby is approximately 6-8 weeks to join a parents group.

Cherry Lake Ward

Over 800 native trees will soon be planted in Grieve Parade Reserve. Altona as part of the Urban Forest Strategy and Working for Victoria Program.

Design work and considerations of the operational aspects of the Brooklyn Community Hall are continuing with the formation of the Stakeholder Reference Group, Construction is scheduled for mid-2021 and expected to be completed in approximately one vear.

An Altona North Local Area Traffic Management Plan has been created for the neighbourhood area bordered by Blackshaws Road, Mills Street, Mason Street and Millers Road. Following community feedback, the revised concept plans are available to view on participate.hobsonsbay. vic.gov.au/altonanorthLATM. As part of the project, works to improve Marion Street, which received Federal Government Blackspot funding, will begin in January 2021.

To improve traffic flow and congestion, the state government has changed all existing clearways on major roads within 20-kilometres of Melbourne's CBD to tow-away zones. In Hobsons Bay, Millers Road from Kororoit Creek Road to Princes Highway is now a towaway zone. Drivers who park illegally in tow-away zones during restricted times may have their vehicle towed and receive a fine. For more information, please visit www.vicroads.vic.gov. au/towawayzones

Sargood Street flood mitigation works are continuing with pump station works scheduled to be completed prior to the Christmas break and the outfall works will start in the new year. All works are scheduled to be completed in February 2021.
