HAVE YOUR SAY ON TWO PROJECTS THAT WILL HELP MEET OUR CITY'S GROWING HEALTH AND WELLBEING NEEDS!

Consultation is now open for the preliminary concept plan for the **Western Aquatic and Early Years Centre** at Bruce

Comben Reserve in Altona Meadows.

This state-of-the-art aquatic and early years centre will provide a much-needed recreation space for the Hobsons Bay community and surrounding suburbs.

The preliminary concept plan has a strong focus on providing for people living with a disability, particularly those on the autism spectrum, and will include an eight-lane 25m pool; learn to swim pool; aqua play splash pad, leisure water, and toddler pool: wellness centre with warm water pool, spa and sauna; gymnasium; change facilities; café with indoor and outdoor seating; offices; and carparking. The early years zone will accommodate three- and fouryear-old kindergarten, and maternal and child health services.

HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED

This is the first opportunity for the community to provide feedback on the Western Aquatic and Early Years Centre. Your feedback will inform future design processes which will include further opportunities to provide feedback.



Scan to complete the online survey McCormack Park is a beloved community park on Jennings Street in Laverton. After two stages of community consultation, Council has created a draft master plan taking into consideration what residents already love about the park, and what their needs and wants are for the park in the future.

The draft master plan includes a story telling river, water play workshop, viewing and climbing tower, bush trail, bridge improvements, socialising hubs, picnic facility expansion, multi-sport court, exercise hub, amphitheatre, redesigned carpark, and pathway improvements.

We are seeking your feedback on the overall draft master plan, as well as the:

- Potential removal of the Williams Street bridge, and the construction of a new bridge at Thomas Street; and
- Design of the water play park.

ADVOCACY **PRIORITIES**

In the lead up to the November state election, we're advocating for major projects in Hobsons Bay.



PROJECT **VIRTUAL POWER NETWORK**

In early March 2022, the Australian Labor Party made an election commitment to install a community battery to enable the benefits of Hobsons Bay's industry-leading Virtual Power project (VPP) to be shared with the community. Planning is under way for the second phase of the project and Council will be looking to the state government to also come onboard as a partner.



PROJECT **QUEEN STREET BRIDGE**

Council has been working closely with the Department of Transport to progress their design work for the Queen Street pedestrian and cycling bridge. Their detailed design work has now been completed and Council continues to advocate to the state government for funds to construct the bridge.



PROJECT **HOBSONS BAY WETLANDS CENTRE**

Council contribution: \$5 million

Additional investment required: \$11 million

Located at HD Graham Reserve in Altona Meadows, the gateway to internationally recognised wetlands, the proposed wetlands centre would be a place for people of all ages and abilities to learn to play in nature.

With a team led by Grimshaw Architects, the centre has been co-designed in consultation with Elders of the Bunurong Land Council using Australian-first biophilic and indigenous design architectural principles. The proposed site would feature visitor and research facilities; classrooms; nature and water-based play; indoor/outdoor public

spaces; a café and office space; accessible walking trails and boardwalks; landscaping and an ephemeral (constructed) wetland.

The centre will showcase the Hobsons Bay foreshore that provides habitat to an impressive range of flora and fauna, including, being home to many thousands of migratory birds that journey along the East Asian-Australasian Flyway each summer.

The centre would activate one of the largest open spaces in Melbourne's west, serving either as a standalone destination or as a convenient stop-off point for those enjoying a stroll or bike ride along the nearby Bay Trail and Laverton Creek Trail.

PROJECT **AFFORDABLE HOUSING**

Council, in partnership with the Hobsons Bay Affordable Housing Trust, is seeking funding for an innovative, environmentallyfriendly community housing project in Laverton. The project will see residential development at the northern and southern ends of 7-45 Epsom Street that provides an opportunity for people with a connection to Hobsons Bay on lower incomes to access housing rent-capped at a proportion of their income.

Council has endorsed design guidelines that will inform the look and feel of the development. The guidelines incorporate community input, including requirements relating to building height (three to four storeys maximum), dwelling density, car parking, vehicle access, and connections with the much-loved Curlew Community Park.

If the project is funded and progresses, further consultation will be undertaken with the local community. The project will be managed and maintained by Housing Choices Australia, one of the largest community housing providers in Australia.

CREATE A BEAUTIFUL GARDEN AND CUT YOUR FOOD BILLS

Want to harvest homegrown tomatoes this summer, or bring more native birds into your garden? My Smart Garden is a free Councilrun sustainable gardening program that can help you transform your outdoor space into a beautiful food or habitat garden. Whether you have a rented balcony, or a larger space, we have free workshops and resources to help you get started.

Local experts can show you how to grow fruit and vegetables at home, make compost to fertilise your plants, create habitat for indigenous flora and fauna, and even reduce the need to heat or cool your home with clever landscaping design.

The My Smart Garden program even helps cut food bills, in a recent survey 89 per cent of participants agreed the program saves money. Shotaro is a My Smart Garden participant reaping the benefits of a food garden in his small Altona unit. His family harvests between 4kg and 15kg per month of fresh herbs, vegetables, and fruit.

"Last summer, I co-planted pumpkins and edamame, letting the pumpkin grow over the roof and the fence to use the vertical space," Shotaro said.

"It's been a wonderful learning journey connecting the kids with nature and seeing their delight helping me in the garden and observing the compost worms."

My Smart Garden is an initiative of Moonee Valley, Maribyrnong, Brimbank, Wyndham, Stonnington, Yarra, Merribek/Moreland and Hobsons Bay City Councils.

There are currently more than 6,500 participants across metro Melbourne.

LOCAL SECONDARY SCHOOLS EMBRACE STEM AND SUSTAINABILITY EDUCATION

Local secondary school students have the opportunity to solve real-life environmental issues through Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) thanks to an innovative Council-led program engaging the leaders of tomorrow.

The Future Leaders in Sustainability program – a collaboration between Hobsons Bay City Council and CSIRO – is a curriculum-based program delivered to participating local schools.

Through the program, students are supported in using STEM to address environmental sustainability challenge scenarios relevant to our community. Through the program, Council is engaging more young people in STEM, sustainability, and the solving of community problems – working towards a greener and more prosperous future for all of us.

Winter and spring are the busiest times of the year for tree planting. We've certainly been busy planting trees to help reach our tree canopy target of 30 per cent by 2040.

Through the various programs and teams throughout Council, not to mention the hard work of quite a few volunteer groups, over 36,000 trees and 30,000 plants will be planted in 2022! This is an amazing result and will contribute enormously towards achieving our target of 30 per cent canopy cover.

2022 advanced tree planting

- 5,500 new trees in streets
- 3,000 trees throughout our parks and reserves

By the end of October, 8,500 new advanced trees will be planted this year.

GREEN STREETS

Grace Street in Laverton, Hancock Street in Altona and Bayview Street in Williamstown have taken part in the 2022 Green Streets program. It was great to see residents work collaboratively with Council to select the planting and species style for their street tree renewal. More than 150 trees will be planted across the three streets to achieve a better tree canopy and keep the streets cool.

GREEN SCHOOLS

The annual Green Schools program kicked off this year with nine schools and kindergartens taking part. The free program provides up to 10 schools with indigenous trees and plants to plant within their school grounds and the option of a conservation ranger's talk or visit.

TREE GIVEAWAYS

Keep an eye out for the free tree giveaways at Council events. So far, 1,500 trees have been up for grabs at festivals, Coffee with a Councillor sessions and community consultations. The small to medium sized trees are perfect for residents to take home and plant on their property.

- 30,000 indigenous tube stock plants
- 5,500 indigenous tube stock trees

The indigenous plants and trees contribute to increasing our canopy cover and enhance our biodiversity and support our local wildlife.

AND THERE'S MORE TREE LOVE

The Department of Environment, Land Water and Planning (DELWP) have funded the plantings of 20,000 tube stock trees, through the More Trees for a Cooler, Greener West program. The program aims to plant trees in urban areas with low tree canopy cover to help mitigate the urban heat island effect.

DID YOU KNOW?

In Hobsons Bay, over 50 per cent of the street and park trees are in the Myrtaceae family. This includes a range of native Genus, including Corymbia, Eucalyptus, Agonis, Callistemon and Lophostemon.

WHYIS THIS SIGNIFICANT?

This dominance of a single family or genus can leave the overall tree population at risk of mass decline if a pest or disease is introduced.

The discovery of Myrtle Rust (Puccinia psidii), an invasive fungal disease that affects Myrtaceae species, in the greater Melbourne area presents a significant potential threat to our trees.

HOW DO WE ENSURE THE HEALTH OF OUR URBAN FOREST?

Our Urban Forest Strategy includes a diverse range of urban trees to ensure the long-term health and viability of our urban forest. With a changing urban climate including hotter and drier conditions, it is important to provide a wider range of species that can tolerate new climatic conditions.

A diverse range of tree species lowers the risk of loss from pests and diseases. It also provides an opportunity to explore a more eclectic and unique tree palette that can enhance local character and create memorable parks and streets.



Cherry Lake Ward

Brooklyn Community Hall construction kicked off in August. Key features of the redevelopment include a new commercial kitchen, additional meeting room spaces, toilet facilities, and a new accessible outdoor area with decking and pathways that will connect to the Brooklyn Reserve. Construction is scheduled for completion in April 2023.

Council will soon seek expressions of interests for community representatives to be involved in the design of a new **community garden** within **Brooklyn Reserve**, adjacent to the new Community Hall. The Greening the Pipeline Zone 9
Brooklyn Master Plan aims to transform a 2.7km section of the main outfall sewer reserve, between Millers Road and Little Boundary Road, into a vibrant parkland. It is being delivered through a collaborative partnership between Melbourne Water, Hobsons Bay City Council and neighbouring councils, Department of Transport and Great Western Water. Outdoor dining in **Pier Street** in Altona just got better with trendy seating and a cubby house for the little ones! We've also removed unnecessary traffic signage and deep cleaned the synthetic grass. Head down to Pier Street and enjoy the sunshine in the spring weather.

Works realigning and raising the **seawall** from **Sargood Street** to **Webb Street** are nearly complete! The project, delivered in partnership with the state government, also widened the shared trail from Sargood Street to Webb Street. Strand Ward

The **Blenheim Road Community Park** in Newport is taking shape. The custom shelters and play equipment have been

installed and the drainage and irrigation are complete. Key features of the reserve include a new path network, barbecue, public toilet, water feature, play equipment, art and landscaping. The park is scheduled to open in November.

The Newport Lakes Conservation and Improvement Plan was endorsed by Council in July this year. The 10-year-plan is Council's blueprint for future conservation and development works at Newport Lakes Reserve. Throughout the consultation period, we received over 300 surveys and three priorities were identified: improving water quality, park improvements and additional vegetation and biodiversity. The Altona North Childcare Centre on

Fifth Avenue will be expanded to cater for 36 additional children. The expansion is a partnership between Council and the state government and will extend one of the existing children's rooms and add an additional room, upgrade the play area and kitchen, and create a permanent staff room. Construction will kick off in September with completion by June 2023. Childcare and kindergarten services will continue throughout construction.

Implementation of the **Digman Reserve Master Plan** is nearly complete! The final touches include improvement to the play space and walking path along the north end of the reserve, which will be finished by the end of this year. 320 native trees are being planted along the **Skeleton Creek** and the **Bay Trail West** shared trail as part of our Urban Forest Strategy.
