ORIGIN

Southern Europe North Africa, and Asia Minor

CHARACTERISTICS

- Medium deciduous tree.

- Foliage turns yellow in autumn.
- Small, green flowers, either singly or in small clusters followed by a small, dark-purple berrylike drupe.

TOLERANCES

• High drought tolerance.

FACTS AND TRIVIA

Fruit is sweet and edible. Supposedly the 'lotus of the ancients' which are described in Homer's Odyssey. Remains of fruit stones as well as wood fragments have been discovered in iron and bronze age archaeological sites in modern day Israel and Iran proving that the tree has been used in food and construction by humans for at least 2000 years.
