DESCRIPTION

Typical height:

15-20 metres

Typical width:

10-15 metres

Growth rate:

Typical form:

Large evergreen tree. Variable in form though usually broad domed with spreading branches.

ORIGIN

Queensland, from coast to tablelands, north of Maryborough.

CHARACTERISTICS

- Distinctive citrus scent from leaves when crushed.
- Bark smooth, and can vary grey to pale grey, light pink or beige.
- Flowers are white, appearing in December through to January.

TOLERANCES

• Moderate drought and waterlogging tolerance. Susceptible to foliar and sap sucking insects.

FACTS AND TRIVIA

Of economic importance in terms of structural timber and honey production. Its volatile oil is an important commodity for cosmetics, medicines, and insect repellents.
