DESCRIPTION

ORIGIN

Open forest and woodland in western Victoria, South Australia and southwestern NSW.

CHARACTERISTICS

- Medium to large evergreen tree.
- Dense canopy of dark green leaves.
- Produces cream, pink to red flowers.

TOLERANCES

- Moderate to high tolerance of drought.
- Tolerant of temporary inundation.

FACTS AND TRIVIA

Produces large volume of flowers in winter and spring, which attracts native birds and bees. Produces a high-quality honey.

Known as 'Yellow Gum' in Victoria but 'Blue Gum' in South Australia.

E. leucoxylon subsp. connata is subspecies of Yellow Gum indigenous to Melbourne. Classified as vulnerable due to urban sprawl and use for timber and fuel but was widespread pre-European settlement.
