









Mixing household bleach solution for sanitising

Household bleach (4% available chlorine) can be an inexpensive and effective sanitiser if mixed correctly

TIPS FOR USING BLEACH

- ✓ Only use bleach that is still within the expiry date.
- ✓ Use bleach free from fragrances and other additives.
- ✓ Diluted bleach solutions should be made daily.
- ✓ Do not mix bleach with detergent.
- ✓ Mix concentrated bleach into cold or warm water, it is safer to do so.
- ✓ If using spray bottles to store the mixed bleach solution ensure that it is clearly labelled.
- ✓ Rinse the bleach solution thoroughly with clean water to remove any chemical residue.

| HOW TO MIX | CONCENTRATION | RECOMMENDED USES |
|---|---|--|
|  Household bleach | 1/2 Teaspoon (2.5ml)  1 litre of cold water  | 100ppm (parts per million)  Food contact surfaces, Equipment, and Floors. |
|  Household bleach | 2 1/2 Teaspoon (12.5ml)  10 litre of warm water 50°C or equivalent  | 50ppm (parts per million)  Smaller items such as dishes and utensils to be submerged for 30 seconds |
