Scam Sleuths Handout

What is a scam?

When someone deceives you into providing personal or financial information, so they can steal from you.

Types of scams:

Scam type	What they do/want?
Phishing	Emails, texts or phone calls designed to get personal information.
Social media	Use fake profiles to win your trust to ask for money, recommend/sell goods/services.
Remote access	Taking control of your devices to steal identity information or money.
Identity theft	Scammers access/use your personal documents (e.g. passport) can apply for bank accounts or gain loans in your name, etc.
Dating/Romance	Use fake identity to manipulate victims, pulling you away from the platform (and security measures) in order to build a relationship then ask for money or gifts.
Investment & Cryptocurrency	Trick victims into investing money, time-sensitive and promising large returns.
Product & Services	Scammers set up fake websites or profiles on actual retailer sites. They then offer products or services at prices that are too good to be true.

Common signs of a scam:



It's an amazing opportunity to make money



Someone you haven't met needs your help – and money



The message contains links or attachments



You feel pressured to act quickly



They ask you to pay in unusual ways (e.g. iTunes/gift cards, preloaded debit cards, Bitcoin, etc)



They ask you to set up new accounts or PayIDs

How to avoid being scammed, some tips:

STOP – Don't give money or personal information to anyone if unsure. Scammers will offer to help you or ask you to verify who you are. They will pretend to be from organisations you know and trust like, Services Australia, police, a bank, government or a fraud service.

THINK – Ask yourself could the message or call be a fake? Never click a link in a message. Only contact businesses or government using contact information from their official website or through their secure apps. If you're not sure, say no, hang up or delete.

PROTECT – Act quickly if something feels wrong. Contact your bank if you notice some unusual activity or if a scammer gets your money or information. Seek help from IDCARE and report to ReportCyber and Scamwatch.

Some practical things you can do:

Spam blocking – Email:

iPhone / Apple Mail

- 1. Open the Mail app.
- 2. Open the email that has the contact that you want to block.
- 3. Tap the contact at the top.
- 4. Tap Block this Contact.

Block an email address

You can also add an email address directly to your Blocked Contacts list in the Settings app.

- Go to Settings > Mail > Blocked > Add New.
- Select the contact that you want to block.

Block phone numbers, contacts, and emails on your iPhone or iPad - Apple Support

Android - Gmail

- 1. Open the Gmail app.
- 2. Open/select an email.
- 3. Press the three dots, and tap "Report Spam".

Tip: When you tap **Report spam** or manually move an email into your Spam folder, Google will receive a copy of the email and may analyse it to help protect our users from spam and abuse.

Block a Sender

When you block a sender, messages they send you will go to your Spam folder.

- On your Android phone or tablet, open the Gmail app

- 2. Open the message.
- 3. In the top right of the message, tap More .
- 4. Tap Block [sender].

If you blocked someone by mistake, you can unblock them using the same steps.

Outlook

- 1. Select the messages you want to report as junk.
- 2. From the top toolbar, select **Report** > **Report** Junk.

To block someone in Outlook.com, select the messages or senders you want to block.

- From the top toolbar, select ... then Block > Block sender.
- Select OK. The messages you select will be deleted and all future messages will be blocked from your mailbox.

Yahoo Mail

- Click the Settings icon ☼ | click More Settings ***.
- 2. Click Security and Privacy.
- 3. Under "Blocked addresses", click the **Add** button.
- 4. Enter the email address you want to block.
- 5. Click Save.

Caller ID & Blocking on Phones

When you make or get a call with caller ID and spam protection on, you can get information about callers or businesses outside your contacts or warnings about potential spam callers. If you see "Suspected spam caller" or "Spam" as the caller ID, the call might be spam. You can answer the call, or block and report the number.

- 4. Under Allow These Apps To Block Calls And Provide Caller ID, turn the app on or off. You can also reorder the apps based on priority. Just tap Edit and then drag the apps in the order you want them.

- 3. Turn See caller & spam ID on or off.
- Optional: To block spam calls on your phone, turn on "Filter spam calls." You don't get missed call or voicemail notifications, but filtered calls are in your call history, and you can check your voicemail.

Blocking unknown numbers:

Be aware that this blocks all numbers that are not known to your phone, unidentified or private numbers.

Do Not Call Register:

What is the Do Not Call Register? It is a free service where consumers can securely register their home, mobile or fax numbers for free to reduce unsolicited telemarketing calls.

How does the Do Not Call Register work? Telemarketers and fax marketers have 30 days to recognise the registration of a number and to stop contacting that number. If they still do, they may be breaking the law or face penalties.

To register your phone number for the Do Not Call Register, you need to²:

- 1. Go to https://www.donotcall.gov.au/.
- 2. Navigate to "Register Online".
- 3. Select whether you're registering a personal number, friend or family member's number, a government number, or business fax number.
- 4. Provide your personal details.
- 5. Add up to 20 phone numbers.
- 6. Confirm your Do Not Call Register and submit.
