
Top 10 trees to plant in Melbourne's west

	Drooping Sheoak Allocasuarina verticillata		\bigcirc	Drooping dark green branches. Open canopy lets light through.
	White Spruce Picea glauca		Q	Column shaped conifer.
	Silver Banksia Banksia marginata		\bigcirc	Large yellow flowers. Attracts native birds.
	Southern Live Oak Quercus virginiana		Q	Spreading canopy. Provides good shade.
	White Cypress Pine Callitris columellaris		Ģ	Small and thin tree. Small cones provide food for Yellow-tailed Black-Cockatoos.
	Tulip Tree Liriodendron tulipifera			Tulip-like flowers in spring. Leaves turn yellow in autumn. Tall, thin tree.
	Yellow Gum Eucalyptus leucoxylon		\bigcirc	White, pink or red flowers. Spreading canopy. Attracts birds and wildlife.
	Australian Red Cedar Toona ciliata			Large tree with spreading canopy that provides good shade.

2	Native Frangipani Hymenosporum flavum		\bigcirc	Fragrant yellow flowers in spring. Slim tree, good for narrow spaces.				
3	Willow Myrtle Agonis flexuosa		\bigcirc	White flowers in spring. Drooping branches.				
4	Golden Rain Tree Koelreuteria paniculata			Yellow flowers and pods.				
5	Harkness Bottlebrush Callistemon 'harkness'		\bigcirc	Red flowers in spring/summer. Attracts birds.				
6	Australian Blackwood Acacia melanoxylon		Ģ	Light yellow flowers. Attracts butterflies and birds.

3	Weeping Bottlebrush (compact variety) Callistemon viminalis (compact variety)		Ģ	Red flowers and drooping branches. Small, thin tree. Attracts birds.			
4	Red Pokers Hakea bucculenta		Q	Red flowers. Shrub or small tree. Attracts birds.			
5	Grey Honey Myrtle <i>Melaleuca incana</i>		Q	Creamy white flowers in spring. Attracts beneficial insects. Can be used as a hedge.			
6	Dwarf Pomegranate (Dwarf) Punica granatum			Edible fruit. Yellow leaves in autumn. Can be used as a hedge.			
7	Gully Grevillea Grevillea barklyana		Ģ	Pink flowers in spring/summer. Shrub or small tree. Attracts birds.			
8	Mulga Acacia aneura		Ģ	Spreading canopy provides shade. Drought tolerant and long life span.			
9	Lilly Pilly (compact variety Acmena smithii (compact variety)		Ģ	White flowers in summer. Edible berries good for jams and sauces.			
10	Citrus trees (e.g orange, lemon, lime)		Ģ	Edible fruit.
