FACTS AND TRIVIA

The wood is commonly used in the manufacture of baseball bats and electric guitars including Gibson, Fender and Ibanez.

The species has naturalised in southern NSW and ACT as well as Western USA giving an indication of its tolerance to a wide variety of climates and conditions.

CHARACTERISTICS

- Dense, lustrous foliage turns yellow in autumn.
- Attractive dark grey bark.
- Reported seedless variety.

TOLERANCES

- High wind and frost tolerance.
- Moderate to high tolerance of water logging.
