







# DESCRIPTION

#### Typical height:

6-8 metres

### Typical width:

6-10 metres

#### **Growth rate:**

Moderate

### Typical form:

Medium sized evergreen tree. Dense broadly domed canopy.

- Linear grey-green leaves form a dense crown.
- Bark a beige-cream, papery and soft, peeling in thick sheets.
- Flowers are densely borne during summer, honey scented.

# **ORIGIN**

Australian east coast, from Jervis Bay, NSW to southern Queensland. Occurs naturally in swamps and along watercourses.

# **TOLERANCES**

- Moderate to high drought tolerance.
- High water logging and frost tolerance.
- Tolerant of wind and saltspray.

# FACTS AND TRIVIA

The oil obtained from the leaves is very similar to tea tree oil, obtained from M. alternifolia. Wood is very durable in damp ground or wet conditions.
