TOLERANCES

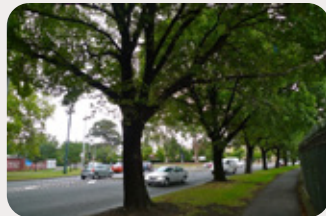
- Tolerant of frost and air pollution.
