Hobsons Bay City Council has prepared a series of research summaries to provide information about the social and environmental conditions that affect our health and wellbeing.

This research summary provides information on culturally and linguistically diverse communities in Hobsons Bay.



Note: Most indicators in this research summary relate to people born overseas or people who speak a language other than English (LOTE) at home.

PEOPLE

Population

In 2021, Precinct 5 (Altona Meadows, Seabrook, Laverton) had the largest proportion of people born overseas in Hobsons Bay (37.1%). Precinct 1 (Altona North, Brooklyn) had the largest proportion of people who spoke a language other than English (LOTE) at home (40.9%) and with low or no English proficiency (7.9%).

In 2021, people born overseas made up 30.1 per cent of Hobsons Bay's population, a smaller proportion than for Greater Melbourne (35.7%).






The top five overseas birthplaces for people in Hobsons Bay in 2021:



Top three birthplaces of those who have arrived in the last five years:






Households

In 2021, a smaller proportion of people in Hobsons Bay who spoke a language other than English (LOTE) at home lived in lone-person households (8.8%), compared to people who spoke English only (11.6%).

Disability

In 2021, a larger proportion of people who need assistance with core activities also spoke a language other than English (LOTE) at home in Hobsons Bay (42.1%), compared to Greater Melbourne (40.2%).




Age

In 2021, a smaller proportion of people under 25 spoke a language other than English (LOTE) at home in Hobsons Bay (22.7%), compared to Greater Melbourne (31.5%).



The top five overseas birthplaces for people under 25 in Hobsons Bay:




The top five overseas birthplaces for people aged 60+ in Hobsons Bay:



Education

In 2021, a smaller proportion of Hobsons Bay residents aged 15+ who spoke a language other than English (LOTE) at home volunteered (8.6%), compared to residents who spoke English only (14.4%). In 2021, a slightly larger proportion of Hobsons Bay residents aged 15+ who spoke a language other than English (LOTE) at home provided unpaid assistance to a person with a disability, long-term illness or old age (14.7%), compared to residents who spoke English only (13.7%).







Income

Construction (9.5%).

In 2021, a larger proportion of households who spoke a language other than English (LOTE) at home in Hobsons Bay were in the lowest income group for equivalised weekly household income (29%), compared to households that spoke only English (14%).

Long-term health conditions ²


The top three long-term health conditions among people who speak a language other than English (LOTE) at home in Hobsons Bay are:



Housing and homelessness

In 2021, a larger proportion of households who spoke a language other than English (LOTE) at home in Hobsons Bay fully owned their home (33.1%), compared to households who spoke English only (28.2%).




Alcohol and other drugs

In 2019, a substantially lower proportion of Victorians born overseas consumed alcohol at levels exceeding lifetime risk guidelines (45.9%), compared to Victorians born in Australia (66.8%).

In 2020, a lower proportion of Victorians born overseas smoked daily (9.5%), compared to Victorians born in Australia (13.6%).

Safety

In 2019, a smaller proportion of Victorians born overseas felt safe walking in their street (51.1%), compared to Victorians born in Australia (55.7%).



Mental health

In 2020, a similar proportion of Victorians born overseas reported high or very high psychological distress (23.1%), compared to Victorians born in Australia (23.8%).



Community connection

In 2019, a similar proportion of Victorians born overseas belonged to an organised group (58.7%), compared to Victorians born in Australia (58.1%).
