This research summary provides information on young people in Hobsons Bay, who are defined as people aged 12 to 25 years.






Population

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In 2021, young people made up 14.4% (13,194 persons) of Hobsons Bay's population, a smaller proportion than for Greater Melbourne (17.3%).






Age


In 2021, Hobsons Bay had a similar proportion of females and males aged 12-17 and a larger proportion of males aged 18-25. This is consistent with rates in Greater Melbourne.

Note: For the first time, the 2021 Census allowed respondents to identify as non-binary, although this was not recorded statistically and is not reflected in these figures





Households


In 2021, there was a similar proportion of young people aged 12-17 living in couple family households in Hobsons Bay (73.9%), compared to Greater Melbourne (74.8%).






