## **Grant Focus**

Grants under this focus area provide financial assistance to community organisations for activities that foster the social, health and wellbeing needs of children and families.

Projects that work with children and their families to create a gender equitable community which fosters respectful relationships and reduces violence against women and children.

Projects that celebrate diversity and challenge discrimination to foster a socially inclusive community that welcomes people regardless of gender, sex, intersex status, sexuality, race, culture, faith and disability.

Projects that support vulnerable children and families to be actively engaged in their communities.

## **Priorities/Criteria**

Applications must identify a need for the project in the community

Applications should address one or more of the following priorities:

- Community building/increasing community capacity
- The health, wellbeing and connection of children and their families
- Organisation/group capacity building
- Social inclusion and participation for vulnerable children and their families
- Networks and partnerships
- Service gaps
