#### Bans on bin contents

In 2019, the Victorian Government banned all electronic waste from landfill. Electronic waste, including televisions and kitchen appliances, CDs, light globes and printer cartridges must be separated from your rubbish bin and taken to various locations. See Council's website for details.



### MIXED RECYCLING



- Putting the wrong things in the yellow bin is a problem. It reduces the quality and value of collected materials, can damage sorting equipment, and can result in the truck's load going to landfill.

- Council carries out regular bin inspections to give feedback to residents and ensure the right things are being placed in the right bins. If you find a sticker on your bin, it probably means your bin contains items that can't go in. A sticker is not a fine.
- Council and our recycling partners are continually working to find new local end markets and recycling opportunities for household items.
- Your recycling bin is collected fortnightly.

### FOOD & GARDEN WASTE





Using the light-green lid bin for food and garden waste will divert about 8,000 tonnes of waste from landfill every year. The green bin contents are recycled into compost and soil conditioners. Food waste can be wrapped in one or two sheets of newspaper or paper towel before being placed in the food and garden waste bin.

Your green bin is collected fortnightly.

# GLASS RECYCLING



Separating your household's glass waste into its own bin makes more glass available to be recycled into new materials, including road and rail projects, and potentially new jars and bottles. Most glass can be recycled over and over again, with no loss to its integrity.

Your glass bin is collected every four weeks.
