#### **Grant Focus**

Hobsons Bay prides itself as a Creative City. Through this grant opportunity, Council welcomes community submissions that will continue to build on this status and enhance community life and the cultural tourism that arts, culture and heritage attracts. Individual artists and artist collectives can apply for a Make It Happen grant through an auspice. Speak to your local Arts Organisation, Community Centre or consider Auspicious arts.

#### **Priorities/Criteria**

Applications must identify a need for the project in the community.

Applications need to demonstrate meeting three or more of the following criteria:

- Provide opportunities for cultural celebration and expression, active participation and/or learning opportunities.
- Celebrate and acknowledge the diversity, heritage and/or environment of Hobsons Bay.
- Support the development of strong and vibrant neighbourhoods and connections within communities.
- Explore innovation and contemporary ideas in unique spaces and places.
- Enable the engagement of broad cross sections of the community.
- Provides free or low-cost entertainment and participation options.
- Recognise, celebrate and commemorate occasions or places of significance.
- Showcase key features of the community and the environment, particularly those that are unique, promote the cultural reputation, bayside location or industrial nature of the municipality.

In addition, applications need to:

- Show proven ability and capacity to deliver within the creative genre specified.
- Have permission granted from landowners for temporary interventions in the public realm.
- Comply with all relevant permit processes, liquor licensing requirements and risk management/planning requirements where applicable.
- Demonstrate process for local community engagement and participation.
- Demonstrate ability to effectively market projects within the creative genre specified.

Through Council's Arts, Culture and Heritage unit, there will be support, advice and guidance provided, however, it is expected that the proposal is within the Group's/artist's/Organisation's capacity to deliver.

If successful in receiving a grant, the applicant will be required to attend a project management information session with the Council's Arts, Culture and Heritage unit.
