# BEYOND THE BIN

## RUNS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

Beyond The Bin is a Council-funded, curriculum-aligned incursion for all primary school students. This free program engages students in fun and practical sessions to promote connection with our local environment and provide education about recycling.

## NO EXTRA WORK FOR TEACHERS

Our sessions are delivered by experienced facilitators who all have up-to-date Working with Children Checks, and all materials are provided. Teachers can choose to participate or simply supervise.

## SESSION OUTLINE

One block, 45–50 minutes

### Introduction

- Story book and discussion of key themes: environment, waste, sustainability, animal life, activism

### Beyond the bin

- How to recycle right at home
- Video: Where does my recycling go?
- What we can do to help the planet
- Interactive class activity: Which bin?

### Conclusion

- Students decide on a small act they can make to help our environment
- Students receive a take-home gift to encourage family discussion

# RANGER VISITS

## RUNS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

We provide free, interactive incursions with our Conservation Rangers for all primary school year levels.

These incursions are engaging and informative, and can be customised to suit the year level and your classroom focus.

Topics of discussion include wildlife and plant talks, as well as the option of a taxidermy animal display to educate students about the unique features of our local wildlife.



### SESSION OUTLINE

The Ranger Visits can run for up to 2 hours for maximum three classes (approx. 40 minutes per class) and can be tailored to suit the group size, interests and needs.

### PLANT TALK

Our experienced and knowledgeable Conservation Rangers can host an interactive chat about the importance of locally indigenous trees, shrubs, grasses, herbs and flowers, and the role they play in our local ecosystem.

### WILDLIFE CHATS

With help from our collection of taxidermy animal species, the Rangers can conduct an age-appropriate talk about our hugely diverse local wildlife and the unique features which help them to survive in our environment.

# WERRIBEE OPEN RANGE ZOO EXCURSION

## RUNS IN TERM 3

Your school is invited learn about our incredible local species and their unique habitat at a free, fun-filled and educational day at Werribee Open Range Zoo.

The excursion is designed to broaden student knowledge on local environment, Indigenous and sustainability issues. The program also empowers students to look at how their local community can reduce environmental impact and limit threats to endangered species and habitats.

## SESSION OUTLINE

The excursion will take place in Term 3 2024 and includes free buses from your school to the zoo and back.

### On the day students will be engaged to:

- foster a greater understanding and appreciation of Hobsons Bay's endangered species
- gain knowledge on local environment, Indigenous and sustainability issues
- look at positive actions we can take as individuals and as a community to lessen our environmental impact and reduce threats to endangered species and habitats

# RANGER EXCURSIONS

## RUNS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

We can host interactive excursions with our Rangers to provide students with a greater understanding of their local area and the ecosystems which exist around them. Students will be immersed in the impressive nature of Hobsons Bay, with the option to participate in hands-on conservation activities themselves!



### SESSION OUTLINE

Sessions run for up to 2 hours and structure is flexible to allow for tailored delivery. The Rangers can discuss this with you once your booking has been received.

### TOURS

Tour one of the many significant conservation reserves or beaches in Hobsons Bay, gaining first-hand knowledge from the Conservation Rangers and team who care for them daily. Learn about the significant bird life at the Paisley Challis Wetlands or Rifle Range, view native wildflowers in Spring at Truganina Park, or learn about how a quarry and landfill became a thriving bushland at Newport Lakes. We recommend discussing location options with the Rangers to find a reserve close-by and relevant to your class.

### CONSERVATION ACTIVITIES

Do your bit and take part in a guided, hands-on conservation activity! Students can get their hands dirty with tasks such as mulching or watering in a local park or reserve, allowing them to get up close with nature and learn about the tasks that our Conservation team undertakes daily to keep the reserves at their healthy best!

**Please Note:** Planting events are seasonal and can only take place in Term 2 and 3. Opportunities are limited – please contact us if you wish to discuss planting possibilities
