WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY

RUNS 2 – 6 JUNE (TERM 2)

Across one week in Term 2, Council offers one-off waste education sessions to local high schools covering the topics of waste, recycling and the environment. These fun, interactive and educational sessions are linked to the Victorian curriculum and designed to align with World Environment Day (June 5).

ABOUT THE SESSION

Students learn what goes in each bin, and the journey our waste takes beyond the bin.

Each session runs for 45-50 minutes and includes a variety of engaging, age-appropriate activities.

SCHOOL OF NATURE & CLIMATE INCURSION

RUNS TERM 1 & TERM 2

Students explore electricity production impacts on climate change, and consider alternate ways that people can contribute to a sustainable future. They learn about systemic change concepts and ways to advocate for a just and healthy planet.



NO ADDITIONAL WORK FOR TEACHERS

Sessions are delivered by experienced facilitators. We provide all materials and required resources – teachers have the option to participate or simply supervise.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Explain what climate change is and the effects it has on our environment
- Identify the major global systems that are contributing to climate change
- Discuss actions they can take on an individual level to create positive futures and how this ties into collective action
- Students can generate unique solutions to questions related to current energy practices in Australia

RANGER EXCURSIONS

RUNS THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

We can host interactive excursions with our Rangers for all ages of secondary school students, to provide them with an in-depth understanding of the ecosystems which operate in our suburbs. Students will be immersed in the impressive nature of Hobsons Bay, with the option to participate in hands-on conservation activities themselves.



SESSION OUTLINE

Sessions run for up to 2 hours and structure is flexible to allow for tailored delivery. The Rangers can discuss this with you once your booking has been received.

TOURS

Tour one of the many significant conservation reserves or beaches in Hobsons Bay, gaining first-hand knowledge from the Conservation Rangers and team who care for them daily. Learn about the plight of our significant migratory bird species in the mudflats and wetlands of Paisley Challis or Rifle Range, learn about the importance and lifecycle of native wildflowers and grasses in Spring at Truganina Park, or learn about how a quarry and landfill became a thriving bushland filled with biodiversity at Newport Lakes. We recommend discussing location options with the Rangers to find a reserve close-by and relevant to your class.

CONSERVATION ACTIVITIES

Do your bit and take part in a guided, hands-on conservation activity! Students can get up-close and personal with nature in a reserve local to them, with the option to undertake mulching, watering, or weeding, dependent on the season, class size and location. This is a great opportunity for students to learn about nature's cycles and seasons, as well as what is involved in maintaining healthy parks and reserves in urbanised areas. The perfect experience for students who may be interested in ranger, conservation or horticultural work, as well as an opportunity for the whole class to engage with nature - and perhaps care for a tree that they can watch grow for years to come!

PLEASE NOTE: Planting events are seasonal and can only take place in Term 2 and 3. Opportunities are limited – please contact us if you wish to discuss planting possibilities.
